

Experience General Practice as part of your JMO training

Your PGY2 year can now include a General Practice term through the Prevocational General Practice Placement Program (PGPPP).

Available to junior Doctors only, this program provides an opportunity for you to experience a Rural General Practice rotation as part of your training.

Terms will be available in selected Accredited Rural General Practices, providing hands-on experience in a closely supervised setting.

This is an excellent educational opportunity for PGY2s considering General Practice or for those seeking to further their understanding of rural medicine and community primary care in preparation for a specialist career.

About the PGPPP term

Junior Doctors will consult patients independently, with access to close on site supervision from senior GPs.

Education will be tailored specifically to your individual needs and delivered via in-practice teaching, hospital tutorials and GP Registrar training days.

During the term, you will remain an employee of your hospital and continue to be paid and accrue leave entitlements in the usual way. All accommodation and travel costs will be covered. JMOs in NSW IMET Network 10 can undertake a rotation in **Cootamundra** or **Gundagai** while Network 11 JMOs can complete a term in **Milton**. JMOs in ACT can complete a term in **Isabella Plains** or **Canberra (city)** or **Narrabundah**.
